Survey of Long Term Care Health Professionals

The 2006 Novartis Senior Care Source, Survey of Long Term Care Health Professionals, includes responses of long term care facility medical directors, consultant pharmacists, directors of nursing, and nurse practitioners to a variety of questions regarding their practice settings, attitudes, and knowledge. One clear message from these survey results is that a growing number of clinicians care for assisted living facility residents. Some of the survey's highlights about assisted living issues are shown here.

22%

of medical directors practice to some degree in assisted living.

40%

of physicians see assisted living facility residents in their offices, while **53%** see the residents at the ALF. Seven percent said they see these residents in "other" locations.

26%

of medical directors said that they serve residents in a freestanding assisted living facility.

74%

of medical directors said that they serve residents in an ALF that is attached to a nursing facility. This likely represents a campus-like environment—such as a continuing care retirement community—where multiple levels of care are offered in one setting.

2%

of nursing home services in the U.S. are attributed to diabetes. Diabetes also accounts for **18%** of home health visits and **15%** of hospice care services.

45%

of pharmacists practice in assisted living facilities to some degree.

34%

of pharmacists who work in ALFs serve only one facility, while **25%** serve two facilities, **11%** serve three ALFs, and **5%** serve four ALFs.

20%

of pharmacists said they serve seven or more facilities.



18%

of nurse practitioners said that they practice in assisted living facilities to some degree. This compares to **58%** who reported working in nursing facilities and **34%** who indicated employment in an office practice.

7%

of directors of nursing reported practicing in assisted living. Of those practicing in this setting, **64%** reported their ALF to be attached to a nursing facility. The reminder of DONs practice in freestanding ALFs.
