## **Artbritis**

Arthritis is among the most common chronic conditions in the United States. Seniors have high rates of arthritis. People who have arthritis use more health services than those who do not. Among those ages 70 and older, those with arthritis are more likely to have stayed in a nursing home than those who do not have arthritis. Almost half of those with arthritis are ages 65 or older and therefore qualify for Medicare. Among Medicare adults ages 45 to 64, 15% of those with arthritis have Medicare coverage compared to just 3% of that age group who do not have arthritis.
